Dear Colleague:

We invite you to join us as members of the bipartisan Congressional Caucus on Bosnia.

The caucus will help to direct attention to the needs of all citizens of Bosnia and Bosnian-Americans, and to foster and improve relations between the US and Bosnia. Specifically, the Caucus will work to draw attention to various issues critical to Bosnia and the region, such as diplomatic relations, humanitarian rights, and religious freedom. The Caucus will work to advocate certain policy positions, promote legislation, and conduct briefings on issues that are critical to the area.

Since the genocide at Srebrenica during its war in the early 1990s, and the Dayton Peace Accords that brought an end to the fighting, Bosnia has made significant progress towards stability and has taken much-needed steps crucial to integration into the European Community. Despite significant improvements, additional reforms and assistance are needed.

International support for continued improvements to end corruption, support religious freedom, and protect the rights of all citizens of Bosnia is still needed. Bipartisan support from the US Congress will be integral to achieving these goals. The Congressional Caucus on Bosnia will work to this end.
