POWER STRUGGLE Now Booking for Virtual Cinema Screenings

In March and April 2021 — During the Fukushima 10th Anniversary and Chernobyl 35th Anniversary and Beyond



POWER STRUGGLE (86 minutes, 2019), an inspiring story about grassroots citizen activists who succeed in shutting down a problem-plagued nuclear reactor in Vermont, is now available for virtual cinema screenings.

March 2021 marks the 10th anniversary of the triple nuclear meltdowns at Fukushima, Japan — a nuclear catastrophe that is on-going and continues to threaten people in Japan and around the world with releases of radioactivity into the environment. April 2021 marks the 35th anniversary of the Chernobyl nuclear disaster.

ABOUT THE FILM

As the world marks the 10th anniversary of the nuclear meltdowns at Fukushima, Japan, this nuclear disaster had a profound impact in the small state of Vermont, as it occurred in the midst of a years-long citizens' campaign to close a problem-plagued nuclear power plant of the same design.

Filmed over five years by filmmaker Robbie Leppzer, **POWER STRUGGLE** portrays a heated political battle to shut down the Vermont Yankee nuclear power plant, located on the banks of the Connecticut River in southern Vermont. The film follows the unfolding drama as citizen activists and elected state officials—alarmed at increasing safety violations—take on the federal government and one of the biggest power companies in the United States and eventually win.

The film captures perspectives on all sides of the controversy, including from local residents both for and against nuclear power, elected officials (including U.S. Senator Bernie Sanders), a nuclear engineer, a company spokesperson, federal nuclear regulators, and many activists.

POWER STRUGGLE is a timely, inspiring story of democracy in action; about whether citizens' voices will be heard against big moneyed interests, and what people are doing to make a difference for a sustainable energy future.

POWER STRUGGLE is also a warning about the toxic legacy of high-level radioactive waste that will remain at the Vermont Yankee site – and at every nuclear power plant around the country and the world – indefinitely into the future.

HOST A VIRTUAL SCREENING

Independent theaters can partner with us to host a virtual cinema screening of **POWER STRUGGLE**. Net proceeds will be split 50/50 between your theater and Turning Tide Films.

It's incredibly easy and **there are <u>no</u> upfront costs**. All you would have to do is promote the virtual screening to your membership and customer base through your email newsletters, email blasts, social media postings and on your theater's website.

We will supply you with the promotional text, graphic images, a link to embed our trailer, and a unique URL for a custom webpage highlighting that the screening is hosted by and will benefit your theater.

Our virtual cinema screenings are hosted on the video platform Vimeo OTT VHX.TV, which provides a state-of-the-art, HD digital viewing platform, as well as handles the credit card processing. **However, we can accommodate theaters or film organizatons who prefer to utilize your own platform for hosting virtual cinema screenings.**

Here's how it works:

• **Email us** your contact information, and start dates of your exhibition period (which can be for a set time period or open-ended). We suggest initially promoting the virtual screening as a limited time event (say for 2 weeks, or one month), then extending the period for another couple of weeks or a month near the end of the first period.

• Please contact us at least two weeks in advance of your exhibition start date, and preferably 3 to 4 weeks in advance, to allow for you to have as much time as possible to promote your virtual screening, and record an optional post-screening Q & A.

• We will email you promotional text, graphic images and a unique URL for a custom webpage highlighting that the screening is hosted by and will benefit your theater.

• Our virtual cinema screenings are hosted by Vimeo OTT VHX.TV, one of the leading online video platforms, which many independent film distributors use for virtual cinema screenings in association with local independent cinemas. Vimeo OTT provides a state-of-the-art, industry-standard HD digital viewing platform and handles the credit card processing. **However, we can** accommodate theaters or film organizatons who prefer to utilize your own platform for hosting virtual cinema screenings.

• With a \$12 customer ticket fee (the same price as charged at most independent cinemas), after platform hosting fees and other administrative costs, the net proceeds are \$10 per ticket, which would be evenly split between your theater and Turning Tide Films. For example, if 200 screening tickets were sold, then \$1,000 would be generated for your theater.

• Consider the option of pre-recording a Q & A with the film's director Robbie Leppzer, which you would conduct in advance on Zoom. This video file would be posted to YouTube or Vimeo in advance of your first screening date. This link would be included on the same page as the **POWER STRUGGLE** virtual screening, so that viewers could watch this following the film. Alternatively, a live Zoom event inviting audience participation in a Q & A could be held mid-way during a screening run to generate more buzz.

• Full-length previews of **POWER STRUGGLE** are available for theaters interested in hosting a virtual screening.
